



You can deposit the author's final version of this manuscript for public display on eScholarship if:

1. You signed the publication agreement after July 24, 2013
2. Your publisher did not specifically request that you send them a waiver or embargo letter. Publishers who do this typically refer to UC's "institutional open access policy."


